1. General description of the situation regarding professionalisation of basic skills teachers

Part of the country – wide campaign launched in 2006 to prevent low levels of literacy and illiteracy involves the development of a competency profile for literacy teachers working in the adult education sector. Related activities available to literacy teachers include, among others, courses for literacy teachers to train former literacy students to become ambassadors and access to a digital literacy expertise centre.
